# **Celebrating Pentecost Sunday!!!**

This coming Sunday (June 4th), marks the celebration of the outpouring of God's Holy Spirit at Pentecost. It's a big Sunday in the life of the church; one rooted back in the New Testament's Book of Acts (see Acts 2); and one that remembers the birth of the church. Aside from celebrating the sacrament of Holy Communion together, this year's celebrations at Calvin will include:

The Welcoming of New Members: This year, it our hope to welcome 4 young people into membership in the church through their public profession of faith. This is a big step in the life of faith; a taking responsibility for one's relationship with God; as well as a taking responsibility for one's place in service to God amongst God's people. We'd like to encourage everyone to come, to be a part of this service, to support those professing their faith, and to welcome them to the next stage of their spiritual journey here at Calvin!

Liturgical Dance: Dance has been a part of worship, and has its biblical roots running all the way back to King David of the Old Testament (see 2 Samuel 6). David danced. Most presbyterians however, don't. At least not in worship. But liturgical dance has it's place. It is a visual interpretation of hymnody and praise music, an expressive form of worship that is (quite literally) a moving form of worship.

This year, we welcome Dorette Pronk to Calvin. Dorette is a Dalhousie University Professor, a member of the Christian Reform Church here in Halifax, and someone who leads in a dance and flag ministry there. We'd invite you to come, and to see, and to experience something of this worship. And yes...it might feel odd. Again, it's not something we'd tend to perhaps



associate with our Presbyterian ways. But...come anyway. And remember, while music, the hymnody, and it's beautiful words and melody can often be lost on those with hearing difficulties, liturgical dance allows them to 'see' the music! Perhaps, it might help us to 'see' it also in a new way!
